In November of 2007, Red Oak Sanitation held their first food drive for families in Forsyth and Hall counties. From this single experience, they humbly realized the impact that a small, local company can have on those within their community in need. Since that time, their Neighbors Helping Neighbors mission has built an annual food drive that has grown to collect over 80,000 cans of food per year and has caused them to rebrand their company to Recycle For The Cure Red Oak Sanitation, which is their recycling partnership with the American Cancer Society. Recycle For The Cure Red Oak Sanitation's mission is to provide a service that is focused on giving, helping and supporting others in the community that are in need by utilizing the resources at hand. Whether it is through Recycle For The Cure; sponsorships in the community like Tennis Against Breast Cancer; or the annual food drive, "Neighbors in Need," their mission has inspired a fulfilling sense of contribution and growth within the company's culture.

When speaking with the owners of Recycle For The Cure Red Oak Sanitation, they shared, "We recognize that any one of us could find ourselves in need at any time, any one of us could find ourselves dealing with job loss or poor health which could absolutely be a game changer. People are just people and they are not in these circumstances because they choose to be. These are real people and our neighbors."

They went on to say, "The credit doesn't belong to us; we are just the conduit. The real credit goes to our clients that support our cause. We can't begin to thank them enough for their business, which allows us to live our mission."
